-Wildfire Update



Possum Kingdom State Park Fire: Up to 90% of the Possum Kingdom SP has burned. The park residence, maintenance facility and 4 nearby restrooms remain were threatened but the staff had done enough burning out of juniper and underbrush around buildings before the fire arrived to save the facilities in Possum Kingdom SP and the Possum Kingdom Fish Hatchery. it will probably be some time before things like power lines, etc. are repaired and the sites are back on operation..

Three fully staffed State Parks fire engines worked in tandem with crews in the park and in the Caddo Bay residential area adjacent to the park. Numerous air resources fought the fire, including black hawks, C130s, seats, ad Type 3 helicopters. Firefighters on site not assigned to an engine spent the day with park rangers clearing juniper away from these threatened structures. Greg Creacy, the Park Division staff member responsible for managing fire operations within the park, and the entire staff did an outstanding job in difficult circumstances.f Approximately 20 firefighters were on this fire with numerous P&W Law Enforcement and maintenance support. Those remaining at PK had to abandon the park in boats,

Davis Mts and Indian Lodge are still closed. They are serving as the base camp for crews or a

couple of hundred people still working the fire in that area.

Legislative Update

At this point the legislative process is for the most part 'in negotiations' between the members of House and Senate. The budget still undermined. The Senate has not yet passed its budget bill. When the Senate does pass a budget, the work will begin between the House and Senate versions.

Other Issues: HB1301 would add a donation to the purchase of license plates, but details regarding the amount that would go to parks, and whether it will supplement or replace other funding sources, as well as whether it will be an 'opt in' or 'opt out' program are still unresolved

SB1905, requiring \$1 from the entry fee at 12 parks to be given to local emergency service providers will be heard on Monday in Senate Agriculture and Rural Affairs committee.

HB1628, requiring appropriation of funds generated by Sporting Goods Sales taxes to THC and TPWD was left pending in the House Ways and Means Committee. Its companion, SB1345 has not been scheduled for a hearing in Senate Finance.

Ground broken for new pavilion at Palo Duro State Park

After years of detailed planning, TPWD officials and dozens of Amarillo-area dignitaries met last Friday at Palo Duro Canyon State Park to break ground for the new Mack Dick Group Pavilion.

Made possible by the Amarillo Area Foundation Palo Duro Canyon Park Fund, established by Mack Dick—a prominent Amarillo-area businessman—the new stone-clad facility will feature 5,200-square-feet of meeting and/or dining hall space, restrooms and a commercial kitchen. All these amenities have been designed specifically to accommodate park visitor demand for receptions, parties, weddings, family reunions, RV groups and other multipurpose uses.

The pavilion, which will incorporate local rock and native materials to blend in with its

rugged and scenic surroundings in the bottom of the canyon, will be a balance of enclosed indoor space and generous outdoor porch space. The state-of-the-art group facility will have a seating capacity of 150 and be enhanced with multi-media technology
